

## Comments on Parts 1 to 6

FOSAF's court application papers were issued out of the High Court Gauteng Division, Pretoria on 28 August 2018 and served on the Minister on 31 August 2018. The purpose of this application is to declare the notices amending the Draft Alien and Species Lists and Regulations that were published for comment in February this year invalid along with all the subsequent attempts to correct the defects in these original notices.

FOSAF needs to bring this application because the promulgation of these regulations will make rainbow and brown trout (along with other useful species) invasive species which will in turn make the stocking and farming of trout a criminal offence until such time and if trout property owners and trout farmers can get a permit.

The Minister may oppose the application by filing a notice of opposition by Friday 7 September 2018. She then has 15 business days to file her opposing affidavit.

FOSAF has also asked the Minister for an undertaking not to promulgate these notices into law until this application is decided. The Minister asked for more time to respond which she was given. That extended deadline has now expired. FOSAF is considering if her failure to give this undertaking means that FOSAF must ask the court to hear this application as a matter of urgency.
